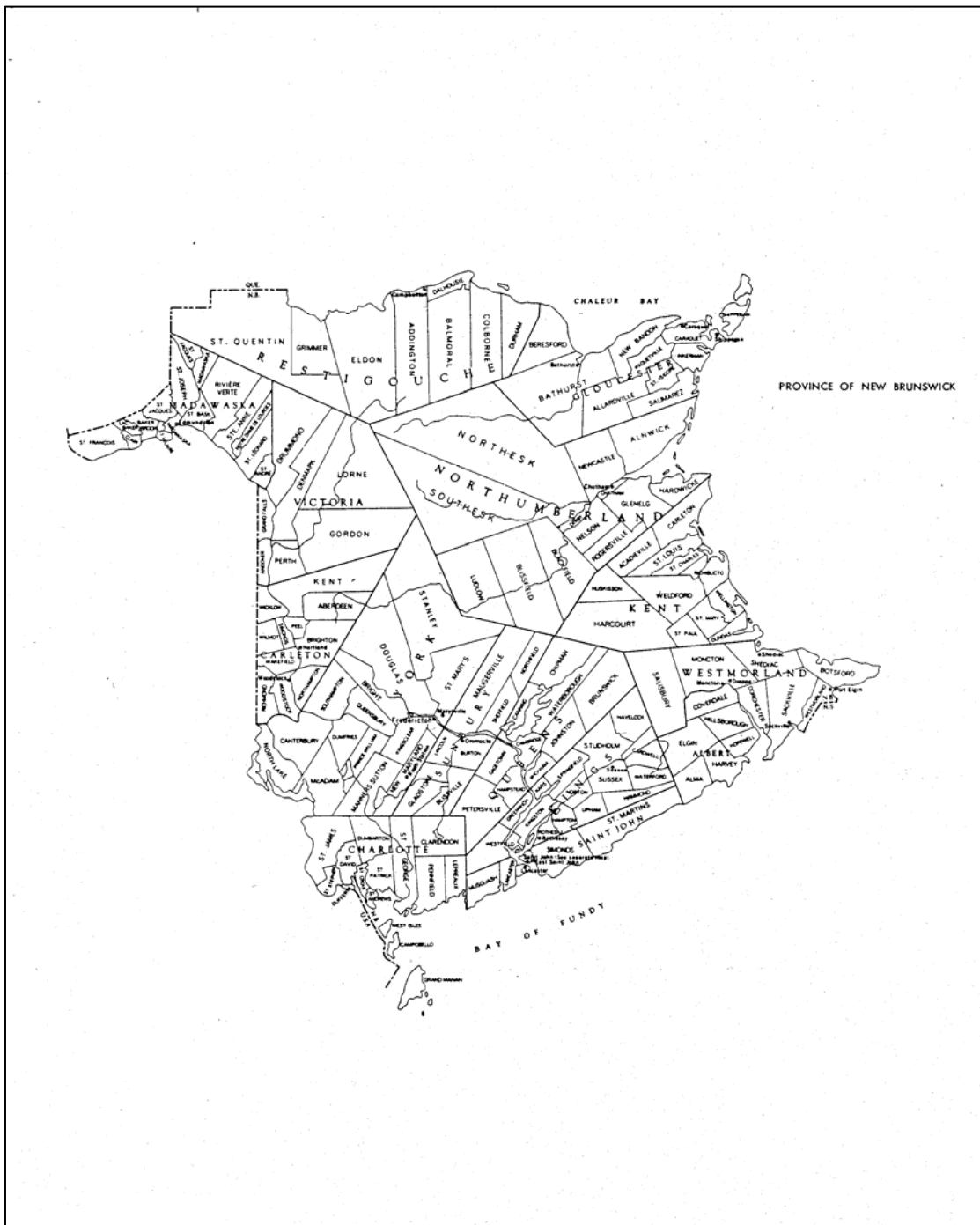

ALBERT COUNTY GENEALOGICAL GUIDE

1. INTRODUCTION

The Provincial Archives of New Brunswick was established in 1967 as the repository for the records of the Province. It also collects private records in all media, including maps, architectural plans, photographs, motion picture films and videos, sound recordings, microfilms, and published data.

This guide is designed for family and local historians who wish to use Provincial Archives sources during a visit to the institution or who are doing research at a distance through their local libraries, historical societies, and using internet resources. Most local libraries have public access computers for their researchers.

2. RESEARCH, INTERLIBRARY LOAN & COPY SERVICES

In order to facilitate distance research, the staff of the provincial archives will do a brief search for each written inquiry. Precise questions have the best chance of being answered fully. Where possible, indexed sources will be checked but because of the volume of inquiries and the intricacies of family history research, neither extensive research nor extensive photocopying will be done.

Many of the Albert County records of particular value to the family historian have been microfilmed and are available through interlibrary loan. Your library may order one to three films at a time. It is possible to access many microfilmed records free of charge through interlibrary loan with your local library.

For a fee, Archives staff can make copies of records and mail them out. For a list of our current copy fees, please consult our website (<http://archives.gnb.ca>) or contact us via telephone (506-453-2122).

It should be emphasized that many government documents have not been microfilmed and must be used at the Archives. Also, most of the more than 3,000 private manuscript collections have not been filmed and must be used in person. This includes material in the Family Histories Collection (MC1) and in the New Brunswick Publications Collection (MC80).

3. DEVELOPMENT OF ALBERT COUNTY

When New Brunswick was established in 1784 it was divided into eight counties. As the population grew the original counties were divided and new counties set up; the final complement is 15. These counties are subdivided into civil parishes.

Albert County is located in southeastern New Brunswick, bounded by Saint John and Westmorland Counties and the Bay of Fundy. It was set off from Westmorland County in 1845. Prior to 1845 it consisted of the Westmorland County parishes of Hopewell and Hillsborough, created in 1786; part of the parish of Salisbury, created in 1787; Coverdale, set off from Hillsborough in 1828; and Harvey, set off from Hopewell and a small part of Saint John County in 1838. When Albert County was formed in 1845, Elgin was erected from Salisbury. Alma was set off from Harvey in 1855.

Researchers are reminded that much of the pre-1845 genealogical data for Albert County is described in the genealogical guide for Westmorland County.

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4. CENSUS RETURNS

Census records for the years 1851 and 1861 are incomplete; those for 1871, 1881, 1891 and 1901 are more complete. The records contain names, ages, relationships, occupations, and religion. They may also include racial origins, entry date into the colony and other data.

Un-indexed and un-alphabetized microfilmed copies of the census data can be used at the Provincial Archives or borrowed on interlibrary loan from the National Archives of Canada, 395 Wellington Street, Ottawa, ON, K1A 0N3.

Census microfilm cannot be borrowed from the Provincial Archives in Fredericton; however, the Associates of the Provincial Archives have various transcripts of records available for purchase.

5. RECORDS OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES AND DEATHS

Although some pre-1888 records of births and deaths exist, they were not required to be kept until 1888 so that is when the bulk of PANB's vital statistics records start. Prior to 1888, each County Council kept records of marriages. Please note that pre-1920 vital statistics are incomplete. Also keep in mind that other records, such as newspapers, church records, court records, etc can contain information regarding births, marriages, and deaths and so they should be consulted as well.

In New Brunswick, official records of birth are restricted for 95 years after the birth. Once the 95-year restriction has passed, the records are available through the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick. Similarly, official records of marriages and deaths are restricted for 50 years after the event. Once that 50-year restriction has passed, the records are available through the Archives. Records of births, marriages, and deaths are microfilmed and are available for viewing onsite at the Archives and through interlibrary loan with your local library. 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Marriage Registers contain information from marriage certificates filed with the registrar. They list the names of the bride and groom, their respective residences, and the names of officiating clergy and witnesses. Entries do not give the parents' names.

Marriage Bonds (RS551A)

Marriage Bonds, known administratively as *Performance Bonds*, were required when banns were not read or the clergyman did not know both parties. They include the names of the bride and groom and the name of the groom's bondsman. Rarely are the names of parents given. This series of documents covers the entire province for the period 1810 to 1932, but is incomplete. County marriage registers should be consulted first; then continue with the bond index listed below.

6. BURIAL RECORDS

NB Cemetery Online database

Please visit <http://archives.gnb.ca> to search our online database of NB Cemetery transcriptions.

Several members of the Capital Branch of the NB Genealogical Society identified attempts in other provinces to provide electronic access to such lists and thought that a similar project here would produce a useful research tool. As a pilot project the Capital Branch established a

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committee to explore gathering the data for York and Sunbury Counties, creating a searchable database, and providing access on the internet. Early on they approached the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick as a partner in the project.

The information provided in the database was transcribed from existing gravestones. This means that stones no longer existing that may have been transcribed in the past will not appear. As well, the data presented is a transcription – no extrapolations, conjectures or guesses have been made regarding relationships between names on the stones, unless the relationship was stated.

As a pilot project the database is only in its infancy and will grow as the work continues. In the future it is hoped that other branches of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society may become involved with the goal being to one day have a database that encompasses the whole province.

7. LAND RECORDS

Land Petitions (RS108)

These are requests submitted to government by those seeking land grants. The records cover the years from 1783 to 1918 and provide the name, age, origin, marital status, number of children, and location and amount of land requested. Additional biographical data is sometimes provided. An index of some 67,000 names can be searched on our website (<http://archives.gnb.ca>) or can be viewed on microfilm F13763 which can be borrowed through interlibrary loan. Please note that many people petitioned as a group. In such cases the land petition is filed under the name of the first petitioner. The index provides the name of each petitioner. Name of the petitioner, county, date, and film number from the index are required for ordering the correct microfilm through interlibrary loan.

Land Petitions: Current Series (RS272)

These petitions cover the years from 1832 to 1966. The series is "Current" in that the Department of Natural Resources and Energy continues to add to it. The documents contain very little biographical data. An index is available on microfilm F16741, which can be borrowed on interlibrary loan. Both series should be checked as one person may have submitted more than one petition.

Land Grants (RS686)

The land grant books form the official land records kept by the New Brunswick government. Beginning in 1784, those who had been granted land under the Nova Scotia government between 1765 and 1784 were required to re-register their grants in New Brunswick. The land grant documents cover the years 1784 to 1986 and describe the metes and bounds of granted lands. The name of the grantee is provided but no other biographical information such as the name of wife, children, or birthplace is given in this record series. An index to these land grants is available to search on our website at <http://archives.gnb.ca>.

Registry Office Records (RS84)

Albert Registry Office Records cover the years 1846-1973 and include copies of deeds, leases, mortgages, liens and other land transactions. For pre-1846 records related to Albert

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County, remember to check Westmorland County Records. A number of wills (those which transfer title of land) are also found in this series. There is a multi-reel grantor-grantee index at the Archives. At present, land registry office records are not available through interlibrary loan.

8. IMMIGRATION RECORDS

Passenger Lists (RS23)

A small number of passenger lists for immigrant ships coming to the province in 1816, 1833, 1834, 1837 and 1838 have survived. The records are available on microfilms F9798 and F9799. The index of passengers and crews, microfilm F17834, contains about 10,000 names. The ship crews are included because some immigrants worked their passage as seamen. Each entry gives a passenger's surname and given name, passenger number, name of the ship and an archival reference number.

Note: Passengers to New Brunswick: The Customs House Records; 1833, 1834, 1837, 1838 (MC80/1263) is available for reference at the Provincial Archives.

9. COURT RECORDS

Probate Court Records (RS61)

Note: Pre-1845 probate records for the Albert County area are part the Westmorland County Probate Records (RS74).

PROBATE COURT FILES

These will include some of the following documents: wills, petitions, affidavits letters testamentary, letters of administration, inventories, bonds, renunciations, correspondence and other items. Researcher should first consult the indexes to the probate files and the probate books and then order from the films listed below. Probate Court files for 1846 to 1904 are on microfilm. Post-1904 files are available only at the Archives.

Court of Equity Records: Original Jurisdiction (RS55)

These records cover the years 1785 to 1912 and deal with a variety of legal matters including the settling of estates and the guardianship of infants. Neither case files nor an index is available on

10. EDUCATION RECORDS

Teachers' Petitions and Licenses (RS655)

This series covers the whole province and contains requests by teachers for licenses from 1812 to 1882. Documents give such data as: name, birthplace, education, teaching experience, church affiliation, and samples of handwriting. Also attached may be certificates and letters from local school trustees and clergymen testifying to the teaching ability of the petitioner and his or her moral and religious character. The documents are arranged chronologically and then alphabetically by the name of the petitioner. The index should be consulted first.

14. NEW BRUNSWICK MUSEUM VERTICAL FILES (RS184B)

The New Brunswick Museum Vertical Files contain genealogical, biographical and historical research information for all of New Brunswick. These records have been microfilmed and are arranged alphabetically. An index is on film F11077.

15. CHURCH RECORDS

The Archives has filmed and acquired on film the records of many New Brunswick churches as listed below. To gain access to church records that have not been filmed, researchers should

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write the church nearest to where an ancestor lived. If the religious affiliation of the person is not known, census records may give that information.

To borrow church records marked (**RESTRICTED**), the researcher must have the in church question forward a letter of permission to use these records directly to the Archives and include a photocopy of that letter with the Interlibrary Loan Request from the local library.
